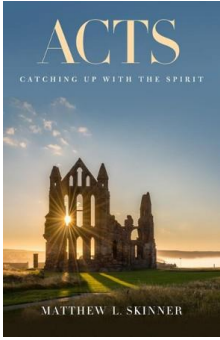




Announcements for Sunday, April 25, 2021

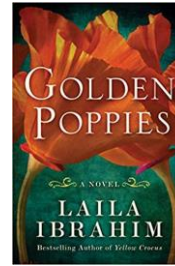

Golden Poppies by Laila Ibrahim
This historical fiction book is the final book in the series, Yellow Crocus. It takes place post Reconstruction period. It picks up in 1894 where you follow past characters Jordan Wallace, a middle-aged black teacher who lives in segregate Chicago and Sadie Wagoner a white wife who lives in a more tolerant Oakland, CA. But years ago, their families intertwined on a plantation in Virginia. There, Jordan and Sadie's mothers developed a bond stronger than blood, despite the fact that one was enslaved and the other was the privileged daughter of the plantation's owner. Not to worry if you haven't read the other two books in the series as the book stands alone but we would recommend you read the books as they are incredible stories.
